

How Do I Apply?

Contact us for an Intake Assessment Appointment, involving:

- Completion of an application form
- Program orientation
- English and math test (2 hours)
- Personal interview with staff member

What Do I Bring to Intake?

- Driver's license or picture ID
- Income verification, recent pay stub (and if married, a pay stub for your spouse) and federal tax return
- Proof of high school diploma or GED
- Proof of legal residency for non-citizens

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
